Local Student Wins \$1000 Scholarship

A local Saratoga Springs student won a \$1,000 my529 college savings scholarship account by participating in the Book Your Summer Utah Reading Award contest, sponsored by my529 and the Utah State Library.

Magnolia P. entered Book Your Summer by taking part in the summer reading program at Saratoga Springs Public Library. In addition, the library also received \$500 for the purchase of books and media for their collection.

my529, Utah's educational savings plan, sponsored the fifth annual Book Your Summer in conjunction with summer reading programs at libraries statewide. Participating Utah children registered to win one of four regional

The \$1,000 scholarship account can help Magnolia P. get closer to her future goals. And they can use the funds at any eligible college, university or technical school in the United States or abroad that is qualified to participate in federal student aid programs—not just schools in Utah.

2020 Voter Information

November 3, 2020



What voters need to know:

- Ballots will be mailed the week of October 12. The County anticipates ballots being delivered in mailboxes as soon as Tuesday, October 13. If a voter does not have a ballot by October 16, they should contact the county at 801-851-8128.
- In an effort to reduce costs, the Utah County Elections office is encouraging voters to return their voted ballot at any of the secured BALLOT DROP BOXES located throughout the county.
- The deadline to postmark your ballot is November 2, the day before Election Day. If a voter returns their ballot at a post office, they need to confirm that their ballot will be postmarked before Election Day.
- Early Voting is available on October 28 - 30, and November 2, at the Utah County Elections Office.
- Ballot pick-up locations will be available on Election Day. Locations will be open from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM on Election Day and Utah laws permitting same-day registration via provisional

ballots will be in effect on Election Day.

- Utah County Elections provides voters with disabilities accessible options to cast their ballot. A voter with a disability can contact their office at Elections@UtahCounty.Gov or call their office at 801-851-8128 for more information.
- Information relating to dropbox locations, ballot pick-up locations, early voting, who/what is on the ballot, etc can all be found on our website at UtahCounty.Vote

Additional Information:

- Election results will be released as early as 8:00 PM on Election Day.
- Election updates and relevant information for voters will be posted on the County's Utah County Elections Facebook page. They encourage everyone to follow and share their content.
- Utah County Elections has taken additional steps to improve transparency, security, and efficiencies in elections administration. Candidates, legal observers, media, and members of the general public are welcome to observe the elections process. If you are interested in observing, please contact their office at 801-851-8128.
- The Board of Canvassers will meet on Tuesday, November 17, at 3:00 PM at the Utah County Administration Building.

This month's subject for preparedness is related to water storage. If your plan is to use a filtered straw and get your water from Utah Lake, well, it may not be the best plan...

A large fault runs along the

eastern edge of the lake, and it's quite possible the lake could drain or significantly be reduced in a seismic event. Making an investment into proper water storage containers could be worth their weight in gold!

- Leave your individual shut-off valves in the "open" position to allow for proper drainage of the system
- After November 1, switch your individual shut-off valve to the "off" position in preparation for spring

As winter quickly approaches, residents can help keep storm drains clean by: clearing the gutters in front of your home all the way to your property lines, picking up lawn clippings that have accumulated in the curb/gutter, bagging leaves, and sweeping away dirt that has

collected in front of your residence where stormwater will flow.

With the increased storm water from the snowfall that runs down the gutters, into the inlets, through the pipes and finally draining into Utah Lake or the Jordan River, please help to ensure that we have as few obstructions as possible in curb/gutters. "Let's do our part to leave it better than we found it". Also, "Only Rain Down The Drain". Thank you for helping keep our waterways as clean as possible.
